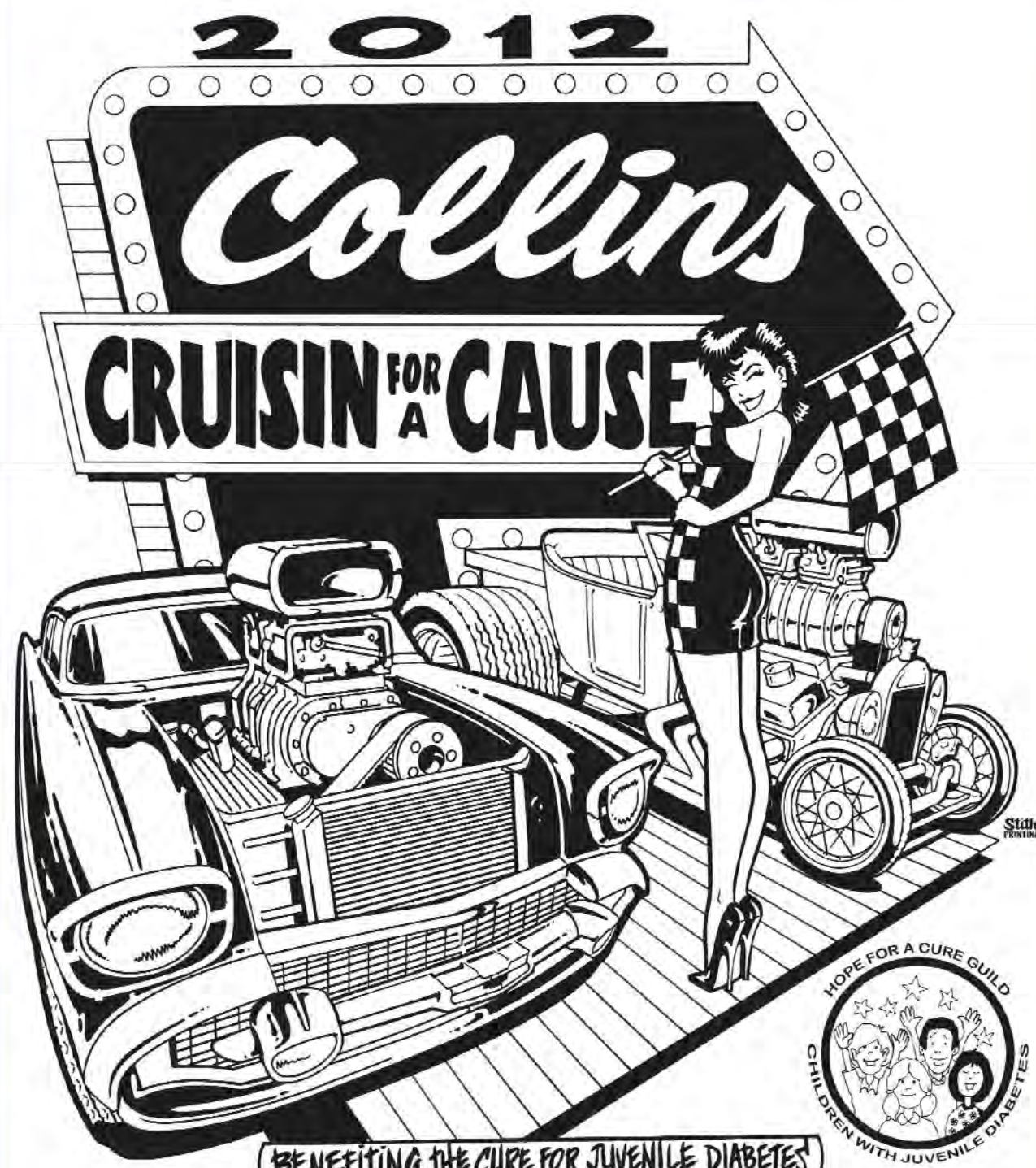


What would happen if a star fell down each time a child poked his finger to test a blood sugar.....the sky would be empty.

We were visiting a friend in La Habra in May 2011 and found the **Collins Cruisin' for a Cause Cruise** event and decided to participate. We signed in, cruised around town, ended at the car show then; the event took on a whole new meaning when we realized the event benefited Juvenile Diabetes Research and Education because our family was impacted by JD. We went home with 3 awards for the 1st time ever, and it was then I knew my son was watching over us that day.

You see, my son, Trevor Paulsen was only 10 yrs. old and had a doctor's appointment for what we thought was the flu. After an exhausting battery of tests the diagnosis confirmed that Trevor had Type 1 Diabetes (juvenile, insulin dependent)! This was crushing and life changing news. He was admitted into the hospital with a blood sugar count of 810 (normal 80-120). My son was then faced with the challenges of counting carbs, very little or NO sugar along with testing and injecting insulin 5 times a day. He adapted better than I thought and continued with his active passions of baseball, BMX freestyle, skateboarding, wakeboarding, surfing, golfing and Motocross. At the age of 16, and the first year of my battle with aggressive Breast Cancer, he suffered a tragic accident and died in my arms.

So, through all of this, I am a firm believer in fundraisers that raise awareness and educate kids and parents on the symptoms onset of Juvenile Diabetes, along with showing them that they can still lead a normal life and continue with their activities. You can make a difference by participating with your time and dedication to this cause and know it's greatly appreciated in the Juvenile Diabetes community. At age seventeen I started feeling very sick. Not being a big fan of the doctor's office I resisted going in until my mother forced me because the symptoms became unbearable. My blood sugar was over 700 and I almost went into a coma without even knowing it so they immediately gave me shots of insulin to bring my blood sugar down. I was confused, frightened and anxious awaiting my diagnosis; Diabetes. When I came home from the hospital I was very depressed. I just felt like giving up. My whole life changed. Self administering shots three times a day, missing work, and learning to curve my huge sweet tooth were just the beginning. Knowing I could no longer have my aunt's peach cobbler with ice cream just killed me.

It was a full year before I reached a turning point. With exercise and routine I started getting back to normal life. I was near adulthood when I was diagnosed The Dynamics were tough to deal with so I can only imagine how hard it is for the kids and their families too, its life altering to say the least. Children are victims of this disease; it's not a result of their lifestyle, that's why I believe in the importance of supporting research and education for children with diabetes. My experience with illness helped me learn to be supportive of others. My high school sweetheart Julie was diagnosed with Lupus.



We continue to support each other's therapy to maintain living a normal life. We hope to demonstrate to others how strength will overcome the barriers of what life deals and be thankful for what you have. Thank you for your help and support with the fight against Juvenile Diabetes.
